

VECTOR ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS

1. **Gresham**: 600 NW Norman St.

Property owner has a standard sized in-ground swimming pool in his back yard. The owner has repeatedly said that he would drain the pool, but is dependant on family members to do so. After multiple documented communications/inspections he did allow Vector Control personnel to apply 90 day altosid briquets (larvicide) to the pool, but he is resistant to allowing us to place fish here. This case has already absorbed several hours of reinspections, and staff time addressing this and no final resolution has occurred. The species found here are WNV vectors.

2. **Fairview**: 23300 NE Sandy Blvd.

Property owner is Townsend Farms, a commercial berry processing plant specializing in frozen fruit and jams. Townsend Farms discharges their liquid fruit waste ditches, the Columbia slough, and the Columbia River. The ditches when flooded with fruit waste are ideal breeding habitat for mosquitoes. The species found there are WNV vectors. There are documented multiple communications/inspections and abatement services have been provided to Townsend Farms. Inspections by Multnomah County have delegated for reduction of breeding habitat without resolution thus far. Note this is an illegal discharge, in violation of their DEQ issued permit
