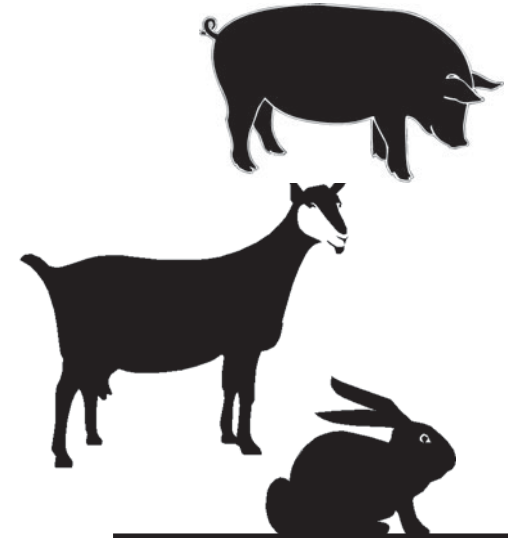
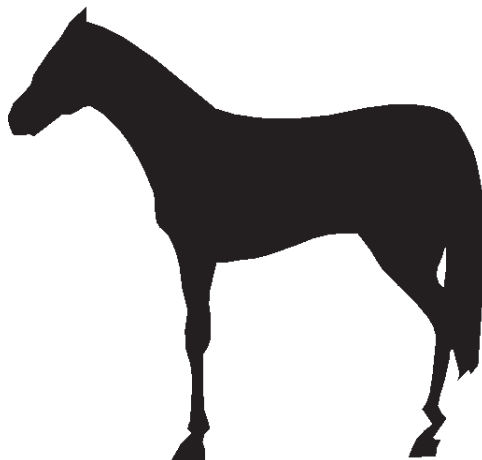

SPECIFIED ANIMAL FACILITY PERMITS

Multnomah County Vector and Nuisance Control is the agency responsible for regulating Specified Animals in the City of Portland.

Specified Animals may include;

- **Livestock**
horses, burros, cattle, goats, sheep
- **Birds**
chickens, ducks, geese, doves, pigeons, peacocks,
- **Other**
honey bees, rabbits, llamas

A permit is not typically required if a total of three or less animals are kept. This applies to chickens, ducks, doves, pigeons, pygmy goats, or rabbits only.

Note:

For regulation of cats, dogs, and other exotic animals, contact Multnomah County Animal Services at 503-988-7387.



SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS



Pigs or other swine are prohibited unless the pig is a Vietnamese Miniature Pot-Bellied Pig with shoulder height 18 inches or less and weighs no more than 95 lbs.

No more than three pigs can be kept at any one address.



Roosters (male chickens) are not allowed within Portland city limits.



Beekeeping of honey bees have special restrictions. Please contact Multnomah County Vector and Nuisance Control for more information at 503-988-3464.

SPECIFIED ANIMAL PERMIT APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

If you are considering keeping a Specified Animal on your property, the following steps should occur:

- 1) Contact Multnomah County Vector and Nuisance Control at 503-988-3464 or www.mchealthinspect.org to:
 - a) Obtain information on Specified Animal Facility Requirements.
 - b) Schedule an inspection of your facility.
- 2) Notify all property owners and residents within 200 feet of the property lines of the Specified Animal facility about the intention to keep the facility.
- 3) Submit a Specified Animal Permit application to Multnomah County Vector and Nuisance Control and pay associated fees.

Note:

Issuance of a permit grants permission for the Multnomah County Health Department to enter and inspect the facility at any reasonable time to determine if facility requirements are being met.
